- Consider the context, audience, and purpose of their writing;
- Understand and respond to classroom assignments;
- Engage intellectually with their chosen topic;
- Deliver relevant content in a compelling and polished manner;
- Convey their understanding of a topic;
- Develop a clear central message that shapes the entire work;
- Learn to deploy disciplinary conventions regarding organization and style;
- Present ideas in an organized and cohesive manner;
- Discern credible and relevant supporting material; and
- Use appropriate and interesting language.
