

**The Economic and Medical Consequences of  
Declining Abortion Access in the United States**

“The ability of women to participate equally in the economic and social life of the Nation has been facilitated by their ability to control their reproductive lives”, wrote three Supreme Court Justices in 1992.

Cate Taylor’s research investigates the degree to which this is true. She will present on the consequences of millions of people losing access to abortion since the overturning of *Roe v. Wade*. These include negative impacts on women’s ability to get an education, keeping themselves and their families out of financial precarity, and how pregnant people lose access to important medical care during pregnancy.
