1. GENDER AND SECURITY FELLOWSHIP - AY 2024-25

The Keck Center for International and Strategic Studies is accepting applications for its **Gender and Security Fellowship Program** for 2024-2025. The Program will recruit 4 student fellows (CMC 2nd, 3rd, and 4th years are eligible to apply) to conduct research and produce a report on issues related to gender and international security. *Fellows* will meet as a group with Prof. Taw most weeks and also attend two special guest lectures each semester. Selectees will receive a \$2500 fellowship paid out in halves (\$1250) upon successful participation in the research program and the completion of the group research project. In order to apply, submit the following to jtaw@cmc.edu: resume and current unofficial transcript, a brief paragraph on your education and career aspirations, and a paragraph on the aspect of gender and security you believe most needs further research and why. Please aggregate and attach these materials in one pdf file and Email to Prof. Taw. For more information about the goals and expectations of this program, please see attached.

2. INTERNATIONAL JOURNALISM FELLOWSHIP - AY 2024-25

Applications due **Wednesday, Sept. 11** to keckcenter@cmc.edu

The Keck Center for International and Strategic Studies is accepting applications for its **International Journalism Lab** for 2024-2025. The Lab will recruit 4 international journalism fellows who will take a required spring course (Gov. 141) in international journalism with Prof. Jones and contribute to the online journal called World Affairs-Asia Experts Forum (www.asiaexpertsforum.org), that focuses on the politics, economics, and culture of Asia, Europe and beyond. With guidance from Prof. Appel, fellows will conduct interviews with leading policy analysts, experts, and academics and publish edited transcripts of the interviews on the Forum website (www.asiaexpertsforum.org). Each fellow will receive a stipend of \$2,000 for their full-year participation in the fellowship program. The program is open to students majoring at CMC who plan to be on campus for the full 2024-2025

academic year. Applicants for this fellowship should send in one pdf file: a resume, name of two faculty members who can serve as references, an unofficial transcript and a brief statement explaining his/her interest in this program to the KeckCenter@cmc.edu.

3. WORLD AFFAIRS PODCAST PROGRAM - Fall 2024

The Keck Center invites applications from pairs of students to conduct research on a region or a theme in world affairs and develop three podcast episodes. Application is attached. Students selected for this fellowship will receive \$1,000 disbursed in three payments. Under the supervision of journalism professor Terril Jones, student teams will develop and post podcast episodes of 25-30 minutes approximately once a month. We instruct how to conceive, plan, produce and post podcasts to Spotify. We do not require previous experience in podcasting. The Keck Center will also post the podcasts on its website (<https://www.cmckeckcenter.org/world-affairs-podcast>), which we recommend you browse before applying, both for inspiration and so as not to repeat previous topics. Students must commit to attend group training sessions with Prof. Jones on podcast development on six **Friday mornings at 10am** (Sept. 27, Oct. 4, 11, 18, 25, Nov. 15). First-year students are encouraged to apply. Preference will go to students who have not received support from the Keck Center in 2023-2024. The final podcast is due **Sunday, Jan. 12, 2025**. You must consider if your schedule allows you to attend the training sessions and to meet the deadlines, and that your topic is specific and feasible. The first payment will be after teams post the first episode; the second and third after teams complete all the second and third podcasts. Direct any questions to Terril Jones at tjones@cmc.edu.
