The Limits of Self-Constitution
May 1 @ 10 am on Zoom

One of the motivations for upholding something close to the traditional concept of self/person is our need to regard each other as responsible agents. This explains the popularity of narrative self-constitution views in contemporary philosophy. This paper asks: can we, and should we, construct selves? I argue for a negative answer to both questions. My argument is inspired by the noted Buddhist philosopher Vasubandhu's no-self/no-person view and opens the space for revision of our ordinary moral responsibility practices and reimagining the notion of responsible agency.
