\*Absentee ballot requires a notarization or 1-2 witnesses

\*\*copy of voter's driver's license number or state identification card number must be sent along with ballot, Ohio also requires this

If your state does not appear on the list above, then your ballot must be POSTMARKED by Election Day. It can arrive 3-7 days after election day. Refer to this resource for the exact requirements of your state:

Absentee ballot requires a notarization or 1-2 witnesses (in most cases witnesses can be a peer over 18):

- Alabama (signature by 2 witnesses over 18 or notary)
- Alaska (signature by witness over 18 or authorized official)
- Louisiana (return envelope signed by witness)
- Minnesota (signature from witness, either someone registered to vote in Minnesota or authorized individual)
- Mississippi (must be a notary or authorized official)
- Missouri (must be a notary or authorized official)
- North Carolina (2 witnesses at least 18 years of age or notary)
- Oklahoma (envelope must be notarized)
- Rhode Island (2 witnesses or notary)
- South Carolina (signed by voter and a witness)
- Virginia (signed by voter and a witness)
- Wisconsin (signed by voter and a witness)
