The speaker was a guerrilla in his youth, a popular educator, a musician and cultural worker, and a builder of African and Indigenous people's movements across borders during the 1990s – the long winter of neoliberalism. This talk addresses 1970 to 1999.

An eminent historian, he was also a diplomat in Angola, Zambia, Mali, Burkina Faso and New Orleans. His awards are numerous including the most precious of them all – the love of the people in struggles for justice across Abya Yala and Africa.

This is the first of 3 talks he will be giving now and in the Spring. The 2 talks in the Spring address **Socialism and Afro Venezuela**, then **African epistemologies or ways of knowing – Paths out of the disasters the planet faces**
"Chucho" stand at the center of conversations and research across the Global South, especially on the African continent and in the Western hemisphere
